FULL PRESENTATIONS:

ANIMAL ADAPTATIONS (GRADES K-5+):

Freaky, Funky Fish and Peculiar Primates introduces students to fascinating adaptions that many animals have. After a discussion on animal classification and different types of adaptations, we use one book to explore in more detail, followed by a Q&A Session.

Typical program is 45-60 minutes for upper grades, slightly shorter for younger grades. I include a high level overview of the writing process for upper grades.

METAPHOR AND METEOROLOGY MADNESS (GRADES 2-3, 4-5+):

Using metaphors in *Wind Is a Dance* as examples, I discuss how metaphors can help with understanding abstract concepts. We'll discuss the science behind various winds and other weather related terms. As a group, we'll come up with new metaphors for various types of weather, followed by a Q&A session.

Typical program is 45 - 60 minutes for Grades 4-5, slightly shorter for Grades 2-3.

IS IT A BOOK YET? FROM IDEA TO PUBLISHED BOOK (GRADES 4-5+):

I discuss the writing process for fiction and nonfiction–from brainstorming ideas to research to drafting and revising—by using examples from my books. Students also learn about the publishing process, followed by a Q&A session.

Typical program is 45-60 minutes. It's geared towards Grades 4-5+ but can be adapted for Grades 2-3.

NONFICTION WRITING (GRADES 4-5+):

I discuss types of nonfiction, researching, weaving facts into story, revision, and verifying facts. Students also learn about the publishing process, followed by a Q&A session.

Typical program is 45-60 minutes. It's geared towards Grades 4-5+ but can be adapted for Grades 2-3.

SIMPLE STORY TIME:

For younger grades, including preschool, an optional and interactive reading from one of my books and a song or two can be done instead of a full program from above. About a 20 minute program.
